### Baptism of the Lord

**Gospel Summary** Jesus came to the Jordan River to be baptized by John. At first John objected and said that it was he, John, who should be baptized by Jesus. Jesus indicated a future baptism when he responded to John saying that it was fitting for John to baptize Jesus. John acquiesced and at the conclusion of the baptism, the Spirit came down from heaven in the form of a dove and clearly announced Jesus as his son. God was pleased with His son. **Reflection for Families** Most parents know what it means to be pleased with our children. Even when they do things that annoy, challenge, or disappoint us, we love our children. Although we experience some notion of unconditional love with our own children, it is difficult for us to grasp the magnitude of God's love for us, even when we annoy, challenge, or disappoint Him. Through our baptism, we are members of God's family and will know the unconditional love of a parent.

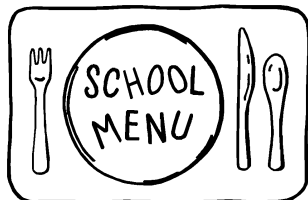
### GOLDEN PLOUGH BIRTHDAY PARTY

### Renewing our appreciation of INDULGENCE

To mark the 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Mary's appearance to St. Bernadette at Lourdes, France, Pope Benedict XVI has authorized a special plenary indulgence to encourage renewed holiness. To obtain this plenary indulgence, the requirements are; 1) a person must go to confession within a reasonably short period of time (around Feb. 2-11/08); 2) receive the Eucharist; 3) pray the Lords Prayer, the Creed, prayers to Mary, and pray for the intentions of the Pope. (For a more detailed explanation on this particular Indulgence, see fliers at Church entrance.)

This can be an opportunity for the faithful to turn over a new leaf, wipe the slate clean and get back on the road to salvation.

*Note: in addition to normal confession times (Sat. at 4:15-4:45PM), Father will hear confessions on Sunday Feb. 3 at 7:00 PM in the Church. While confessions are heard, the 'Scriptural Rosary' will be prayed in the Church.*
