Through his paschal mystery, the Lord Jesus redeemed the human race and gave perfect glory to the Father. By dying, Christ destroyed our death; by rising, he restored our life. The Easter Triduum, when we celebrate the suffering, death and resurrection of our Lord, is the high point of the liturgical year.

The Easter solemnity is to the year what Sunday is to the week.

NOTE Celebrations of the Easter Triduum will 'look different' from other years. The Diocese has provided us with directions and protocols to follow to ensure the safety of all.

Paschal Fast: The Church of God fasts today to honour the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare to share more deeply in the joy of his resurrection.

Good Friday is a universal day of fasting and abstinence from meat.
